

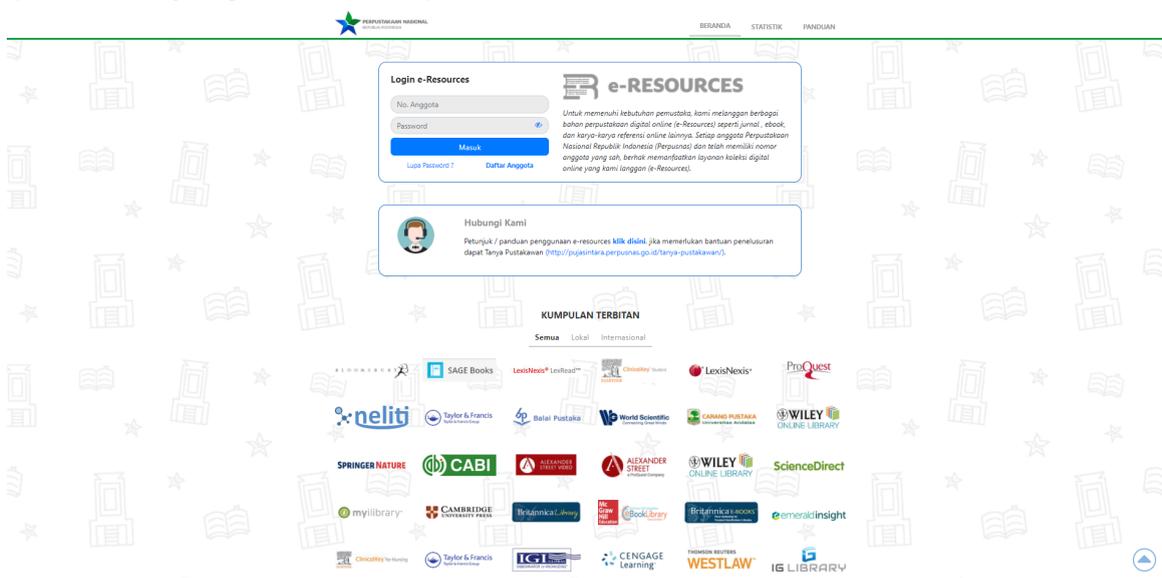

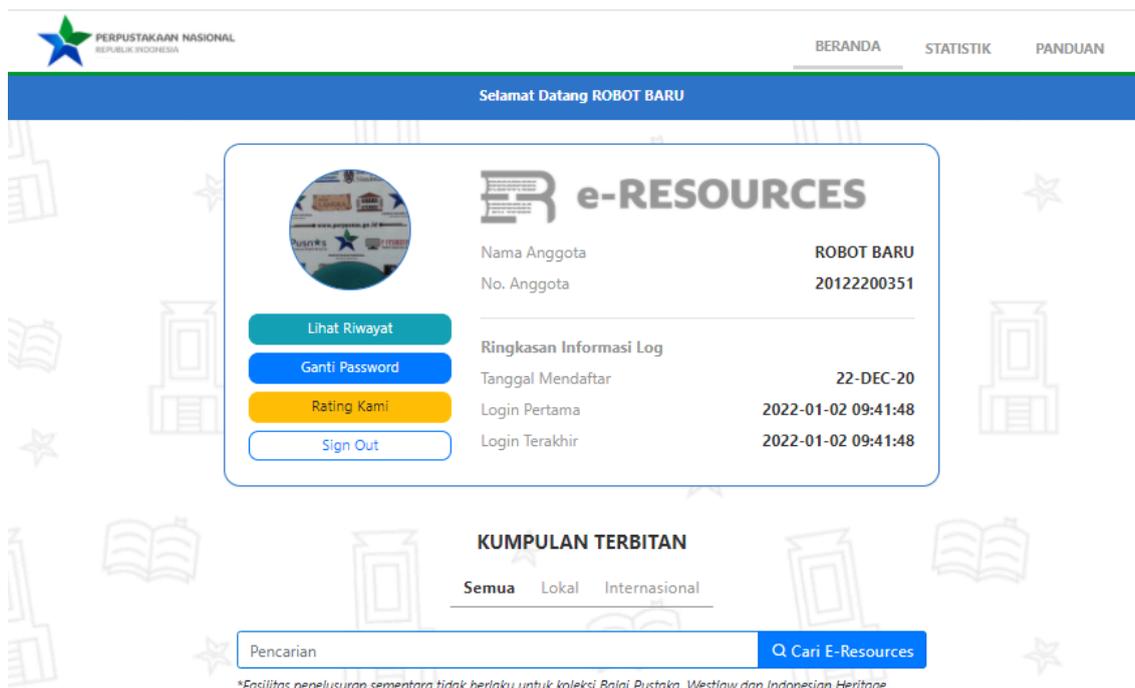

1. Buka e-resources.perpusnas.go.id dan login menggunakan nomor anggota dan password yang diinput saat pendaftaran.

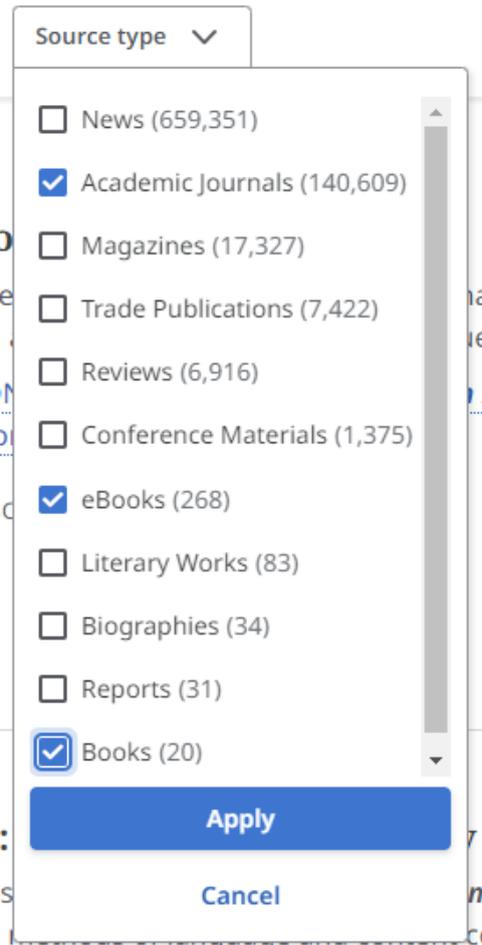

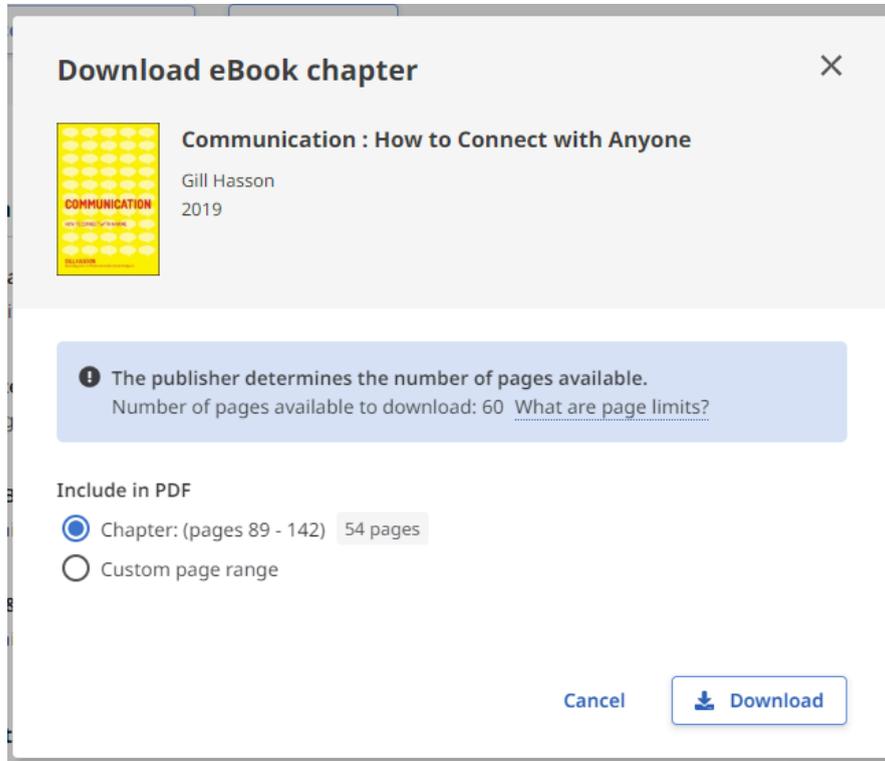

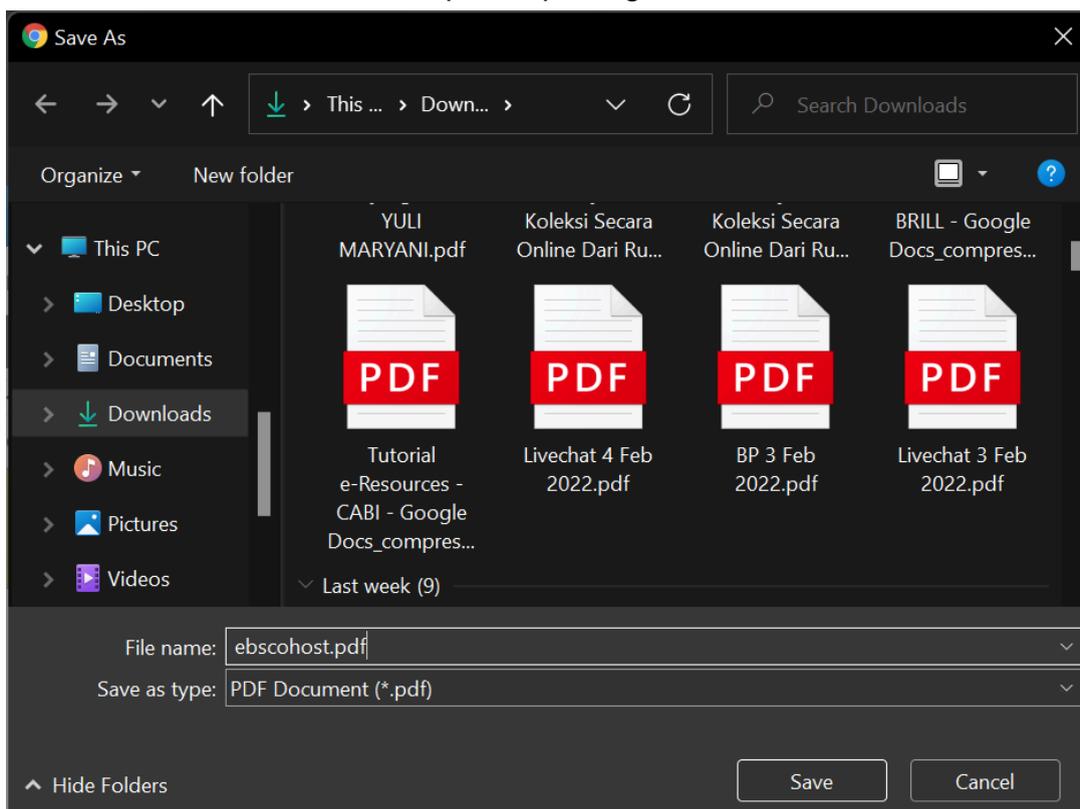

From communication to communalization: a Husserlian account

Abstract
Husserl's writings on sociality have received increasing attention in recent years. Despite this growing interest, Husserl's reflections on the specific role of communication remain underexplored. In this paper, we aim to fill this gap by reconstructing the various ways in which Husserl draws systematic connections between communication and communalization. As will become clear, Husserl's analysis converges with much more recent ideas defended by Margaret Gilbert and Naomi Eilan.

1 Introduction

It is a well-established fact that the writings of the early and classical phenomenologists contain rich and multifaceted analyses of empathy. Does classical phenomenology also offer illuminating insights concerning the nature of dialogical communication and communal being-together? In her book *Between You and I – Dialogical Phenomenology*, Stawarska offers a rather negative verdict. As she writes,

classical phenomenology may be subject to an individualist bias that privileges first-person subjectivity over against communal relationality and leads to the neglect of I-you connectedness. This neglect is most clearly apparent within
